Catherine's Commentary

In a Gallup Poll taken a few years ago, 30 percent of Americans described themselves as "spiritual but not religious." For all of us church goers, that's not good news. All mainline denominations have experienced the effects of this trend. Bringing people into our churches is becoming more and more challenging. Fortunately, an even greater number, about 48 percent, of respondents to the same poll, described themselves as "spiritual *and* religious." That helps.

Lately, you may have heard me talking about "backdoor evangelism." This term could be interpreted in many different ways, but what it means to me is

trying to address the needs of those folks who describe themselves as spiritual, whether religious or not. Both the "spiritual but not religious" and "spiritual and religious" are people who may eventually be looking for a spiritual community to call home. Reaching out into the community by offering spiritual experiences seems like the logical way to go. That is something we can do!

You may have noticed that Grace Church, being who we are ecumenically speaking, necessarily holds lightly to our religion. The nature of our
